Dear InPOG members,

Our mission is to "To improve the outcomes of children with cancer in India by collaborative research." If the activities and discussions of the last few months can be used as an indicator, there is an enormous interest among many of us to be part of this. Consequently, as reported last time, two trials have registered with InPOG. We are now pleased to report that the InPOG-HL-15-01 is currently recruiting in 4 centres, with several others in the process of obtaining ethical approval. Three patients have been recruited till date. These are but small, initial steps but they are also purposeful and well planned. Every quarter we will bring you updates on how these trials are progressing as well as the new trials registering.

In the coming months there are many conferences of interest and we would like to flag up three of them.

The 47th annual congress of SIOP is from 8th-11th October in Cape Town. As always there is likely to be a sizeable Indian contingent. 142 (13.6%) out of the 1044 abstracts at SIOP this year are from India including 25 oral presentations, 21 poster discussion, and 96 posters.

Later in November from the 20th-22nd, we will have the 19th annual conference on the PHO Chapter of IAP (PHOCON) in Pune.

It promises to be an exciting meeting. On the afternoon of the 20th of November, there will be a 3 hour session dedicated to InPOG with updates from each of the study groups. Details will be sent via email in next 4 weeks.

New important facts to note related to clinical trials

Ministry of Health & Family Welfare has recently released The Drugs & Cosmetics (5th amendment) Rules, 2015 published as GSR no. 611(E) on 31st July, 2015, in the Gazette of India.

The said amendment modifies the requirement of Audio-Visual Recording of the Informed Consent Process during Clinical Trials as below:

"An audio - video recording of the informed consent process in case of vulnerable subjects in clinical trials of New Chemical Entity or New Molecular Entity including procedure of providing information to the subject and his understanding on such consent, shall be maintained by the investigator for record. Provided that in case of clinical trial of anti-HIV and anti-Leprosy drugs, only audio recording of the informed consent process of individual subject including the procedure of providing information to the subject and his understanding on such consent shall be maintained by the investigator for record."
